

WHO WE ARE

ADAM'S P.A.C.E. (2005) is a unique program of Riverside School Board and Champlain College. Housed in Champlain College Saint-Lambert, it is a community-based inclusive program for young adults (aged 18-21) with developmental disabilities. The ADAM'S P.A.C.E. program has three components: academic, social skill development and participation in CEGEP life and preparation for employment. Students follow a Modified General Studies Path recognized by the Quebec Ministry of Education.

CURRICULUM OVERVIEW:

- a) English Language Arts, French Second Language
- b) Math, Contemporary World
- c) Physical Education and Health
- d) Financial World
- e) Entrepreneurship and Exploration of Vocational Training
- f) Ethics and Religions

Students benefit from the many learning opportunities provided within the Champlain College community. They audit one CEGEP course of their choice per semester. They also take full advantage of daily campus life joining special interest clubs, attending extracurricular events and participating in social activities with their peers. This program aims to prepare each graduate for the independent pursuit of a successful adult life to the best of their ability.



ON-THE-JOB TRAINING

This component gives students hands-on training in a variety of work environments suited to their abilities and interests. They learn about expectations in the work environment, practice good work habits and improve social skills. This invaluable training prepares students for their future entry into the workforce.

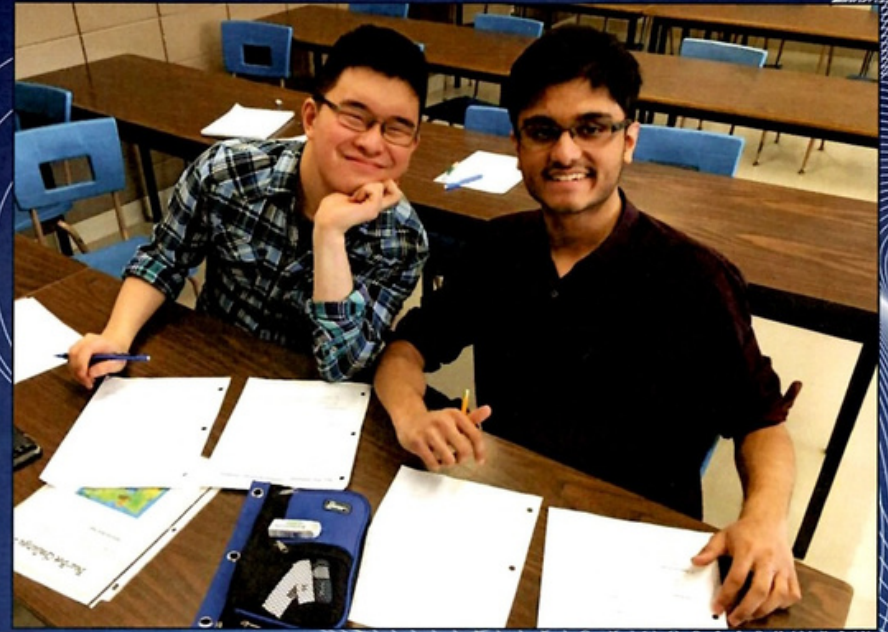
INDIVIDUAL TRANSITION PLANS (ITPs)

These plans emphasize the goals identified by and for each student with a view to transitioning to adult life. Goals are developed collaboratively with the students, their parents and teachers. ITPs form the basis from which individualized schedules are developed. Important information about community agencies (such as **SEMO**, **CLSCs** and **CISSMO**) is also provided to students and their families.



FRIENDSHIP AND COMMUNITY TIES (F.A.C.T.)

The F.A.C.T. Project brings students from the ADAM'S P.A.C.E. program together with other Champlain College students, to plan and participate in collegial activities. The project fosters autonomy and friendships, creating a welcoming and inclusive community where all feel they belong.
